English Paper Piecing Technique Friday, September 28, 2018 Morning Workshop

Whether you are new to English Paper Piecing (EPP) or have used this technique for years, you will learn something new in this workshop. It is packed with information on **FIVE** different techniques and many variations of EPP. Using Grandmother's Flower Garden as the project, student will learn all of the techniques and tools needed to decide

which method they prefer and which technique is most suitable. Some of the unique samples shown in class will be sure to inspire a new quilting project.

Students need to purchase a kit (\$10). The kit includes:

- Small Yazzii zippered pouch – assorted colors
- $\frac{3}{4}$ " Grandmother's Flower Garden Kit – Paper Pieces and fabric in assorted colors
- 1" Grandmother's Flower Garden Kit – Paper Pieces and fabric in assorted colors
- 1 Clover Wonder Clip
- 1 Needle
- 1 Applique Pin
- 1 Diamond Paper Piece
- 1 Apple Core Paper Piece
- 1 Dresden Plate Paper Piece
- 1 Freezer Paper $\frac{1}{2}$ " hexagon with fabric
- Scrap Fabric for Diamond, Apple Core, and Dresden Plate

Thread will be available for use in class although you may wish to bring assorted thread of your choice

Supply List:

- Scissors
- Your favorite needle – optional
- Glue stick or glue pen – some will be available to share
- Small scraps of fabric – optional if you wanted to use your own
- Hole punch – optional, one will be available to share
- Thread – optional if you bring your own fabric and need to match
- Thimble – optional
- Pen for taking notes – workshop notes will be provided
- Fabric marking pen – optional



Jewel Bowl using English Paper Piecing Friday September 28, 2018 Afternoon Workshop

In this workshop students will be making a Jewel Bowl using 3/4" Paper Pieces, fusible web and English Paper Piecing techniques. The Jewel Bowl measures 2" x 2" x 2".

At the end of the workshop students will have a finished (or nearly finished) a bowl and have learned the basic technique of making it in various shapes and sizes. These bowls are addictive to make and make great gifts.

Students need to purchase either a Standard Kit or an Optional Kit.

Standard Kit - \$5.00 (payable to Cheryl See at the workshop)

- (4) 3/4" Hexagon Paper Pieces
- (4) 3/4" Half Hexagon Paper Pieces
- (4) 3/4" 6 point Diamond Paper Pieces
- 3/4" Square Paper Piece
- 3" X 6 1/2" fusible web

Optional Kit - \$7.00 (payable to Cheryl See at the workshop)

- (4) 3/4" Hexagon Paper Pieces
- (4) 3/4" Half Hexagon Paper Pieces
- (4) 3/4" 6 point Diamond Paper Pieces
- 3/4" Square Paper Piece
- 3" X 6 1/2" fusible
- 1 Fat Sixteenth fabric
- 1 1/4" X 11" strip of fabric
- Thread to match

Supply List:

- If purchasing standard kit **only** - several Fat Sixteenths (9" X 11") of contrasting solid fabrics or fabrics that read as solids. A fabric like Batik works great!
- If purchasing standard kit **only** - Strong, thin thread to match
- Sharp pointy fabric scissors that will cut a thick fusible
- Appliqué needle
- Between needle
- Fray check if desired
- Clover small Wonder Clip (not necessary, but may be helpful)
- Fabric marker- example- Pilot Frixion
- Thimble
- Notebook and pen
