

Sujata Shah “Organized Chaos” workshop - Friday, Sept. 9, 2022 (9 AM - 4 PM)



Make an old favorite with a modern twist. Making a scrap quilt has never been so much fun. Learn about values and colors by observing everyday life. During the class I share how I see colors and interpret them into quilts. Creativity is not about having a lot to choose from but how to choose wisely. This quilt is a true scrap quilt. You will learn how sometimes self-created limits provide the best results.

Supply List:

Blocks:

- 30 Fat Quarters or 1/4 yards of small prints, solids and some large prints
- Kaleidoscope ruler by Marti Michell or any other for 8" finished block
- Sewing Machine
- Organized Chaos Pattern (available for purchase) \$12 payable to Sujata Shah
- Basic Sewing supplies and rotary cutting tools
- Design wall (twin size batting)

Fabric Selection

When selecting fabrics, select two to three colors and then choose an array of shades of those colors. Keep in mind that this pattern lands itself better if the fabric selection is limited to smaller and medium size prints.

We will explore and discuss the value, contrast and textures in the class.

Pre-class homework

From few of the 30 fabrics, fabric

Cut 2 strips 2 1/2" X 22"

Cut 8 Squares 3 1/4" X 3 1/4". Cut diagonally once to make 16 corner triangles.

Note to the students -

We will go through the contrast, values and textures. Please bring fabrics keeping in mind that you will not end up using them all.
